




#### Q2 How old are you?






## Q4 Where is your main place of work, training or study?

# Q5 Are there any ways which you think road safety in the parish can be improved?









# Q7 Would you be interested in being part of a neighbourhood watch scheme or similar?





# Q8 Are you affected by poor internet service/ would benefit from faster , more reliable broadband?





### Q9 would you consider paying for faster/ more reliable broadband?





#### Q10 Are you affected by poor mobile phone signal where you live?





# Q11 Where do you normally get your information about what is happening in the parish?





# Q12 Do you think there could be improved cycle and walking connections between the parish and Ludlow, linking up existing paths and routes?





# Q13 St Mary's church Bitterley. Did you know it is a Grade II\* listed building and as such it is in the top 8% of nationally important heritage buildings?





# Q14 Did you know St Mary's church has recently been placed on Historic England's 'Heritage at risk' register?





# Q15 Would you be interested in getting involved in a project on the history and heritage of the church to help it's sustainability?








